



2.1 Inserting the SIM Card

2.2 Turning the phone on

To turn the phone on, press and hold the **End/Power Key**. Enter the PIN code if required.


2.3 Charging the Battery

- Ensure the battery is inserted in the handset. To charge the battery, plug in the charger connector at the bottom of your phone (USB interface) and then plug the other end into an AC power socket.
- The battery symbol indicates the charging status. While charging, the charge indicators will scroll. When all the scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged.
- Disconnect the charger from the phone.
- Disconnect the charger from the AC power socket.

Note: If the battery is powerless, the battery icon will reappear after a few minutes of charging.

2.4 Inserting a T-Flash Card

- Lift up the T-Flash card cover under of the SIM card slot. Pull the cover to the right if it is locked and then lift it.
- With the metal contacts facing down, gently insert the T-Flash card into the cover, then press the cover down.
- Press and pull the cover to the down to lock it.



2.5 Important Password

Phone lock password is 0000.

3 Text Entry

3.1 Input method

During text editing mode, you can press the # Key to switch input modes or press the N1 key [Options] and select Input Method to select different input modes.

Entering Symbols: In any input mode, press the * Key to open the symbols input screen.

3.2 English Input Mode

In English input mode, you may have to press a key several times to enter a letter from the keyboard. Press a key continuously to select the English letter represented by the key. Press once to enter the first letter and press twice to enter the second letter. The English input mode includes several input methods, Smart ABC, Smart abc, ABC, abc etc.

3.3 Numeral input mode

Press corresponding number with Numeric keys 0-9.

4 Calling

4.1 Making a Call

Note: You can make a call only when the network name appears on the screen.

- In idle mode, enter the phone number.
- Press the **Dial/Answer key** to dial the number.
- Press the **End/Power Key** to end the call.

Note: During a call, press the Volume key to adjust the volume.

Note: In most countries, recording telephone conversations is subject to legislation. We advise you to notify the caller if you intend to record your conversation and only do so if they agree.

4.2 Making an International Call

- Press the * Key twice quickly until "+" appears on the screen.
- Enter the country code.
- Enter the area code (normally without the 0 before it) followed by the phone number.
- Press the **Dial/Answer key** to call directly.

4.3 Making a call from the phonebook

Access the Phone Book List, scroll to search the desired number, press to call the number.

Last Number Redial

- In the standby mode, press to access the Call logs.
- Press the **Up/Down key** to reach the desired number or name and press .

4.4 Speed Dial

If you already set the speed dial numbers, then you can long press number key 2 to 9 to dial set numbers out under standby mode. Long pressing number key 1 is to dial to voice mailbox if you already set the mailbox number.

4.5 Receiving a Call

Press to receive incoming call.

During a call, you can operate by pressing (Hold single call, End single call, New call, Phone Book, Messages, Sound recorder, Background sound, DTMF.

Press end key to end a call.

4.6 Reject a Call

Press END Key or Right soft key to reject an incoming call.

4.7 Options in Call

During a call, you can operate by pressing Answer key: Hold single call, End single call, New call, Phone Book, Messages, Sound recorder, Background sound, DTMF.

Side key to adjust volume

You can press volume key to adjust volume during the call.

5 Call Centre

5.1 Missed calls

This menu displays received calls that you did not answer. In the missed calls list, you can view the details of the record by pressing the Ok key or soft key (left). In the view screen, you can Call, Delete, Send SMS, Send MMS, Edit before call, Edit the number, or you can execute other function, such as view the detail information of the call, Delete all the Missed Calls.

5.2 Received calls

This menu displays the most recent 20 calls you have received.

In the list of received calls, you can view the details of the record by pressing the Ok key or soft key (left). In the view screen, you can Call, Delete, Send SMS, Send MMS, Edit before call, Edit the number, or you can execute other function, such as view the detail information of the call, Delete all the Received calls.

5.3 Dialed calls

This menu displays that you have dialed. In the dialed calls list, you can view the details of the record by pressing the Ok key or soft key (left). In the view screen, you can Call, Delete, Send SMS, Send MMS, Edit before call, Edit the number, or you can execute other function, such as view the detail information of the call, Delete all the Received calls.

5.4 Call timers

This menu displays the time log for calls made and received. The time of the last call's, and by execute the "Reset all" function, you can reset all the logs.

5.5 Call cost

This network feature displays the cost of calls. This menu is available only if your SIM card supports this feature. Note that this is not intended to be used for billing purposes, and also you can reset the cost record.

5.6 Message counter

You can view the numbers of sent and received SMS.

5.7 GPRS counter

You can view the numbers of sent or received GPRS, and also you can reset the counter.

6 Phone Book

You can store phone numbers on your SIM card and in your phone's memory. The SIM card and phone's memory are physically separate, but they are used as a single entity called Phone Book.

6.1 Quick search

Input the first character of the name you are searching for in the cursor, and then all records meeting the conditions will be displayed.

Search results will be different due to different input methods.

6.2 Add new contact

Use this menu to add a new contact to SIM card or phone.

6.3 Sent SMS or MMS

When you select the contact, you can press the "options" key to select the "Sent text message" or "send multimedia message" to send a SMS or MMS.

6.4 Call

After you have search the contact you wanted, you can press the to call the number.

6.5 View or Edit

After you have search the contact you wanted, you can view the detailed information of the contact, or edit the information of the contact.

6.6 Delete

You can delete the contact you selected.

6.7 Set N1 or N2

Select the two keys, you can set the urgency number.

6.8 Copy or Move

You can copy or move the selected number form the phone to the SIM card or from the SIM card to the phone.

6.9 Send contact

You can sent the contact you selected through the SMS or MMS, and also you can Via Bluetooth sent it.

6.10 Mark several

Through the key you can mark several contacts, after doing this you can send SMS or delete the marked numbers and so on.

6.1.1 Settings

The options are Preferred Look, Speed dial, My number, Extra numbers, Memory status, Copy contacts, Move contacts, Delete all contacts.

7 Organizer

Use this menu to keep track of your schedule. You can also use convenient features, such as Alarm, Calendar, Notes, Calculator, Bluetooth.

To access this menu, press [Menu] in Idle mode and select Organizer.

7.1 Alarm

The mobile phone provides 1 alarm and you can set it as your need. If you have configured an alarm, an icon indicated that you have configured the alarm will appear. No icon will show if you don't set an alarm. Select "Edit" to set the current alarm.

7.2 Calendar

You can view and edit the memo of a specified date with this function.

- View: User is able to view the task which is added by user.
- View all: View all the tasks.
- Add event: User is able to select task type and enter Start and End date, time.
- Jump to Date: Skip to the specified date to view or edit the daily arrangements of the day.
- Delete event: you also can select delete the events.

7.3 Notes

You can save the job which you need to in the list. Select **Menu** **Organizer** **Notes**.

7.4 Calculator

You can use this tool to help you do arithmetic operations, The calculator can add, subtract, multiply and divide.

7.5 Bluetooth

You should select **Menu** > **Organizer** > **Bluetooth**. In the Bluetooth screen, select Power On. Next, select Search audio device if you want to connect to an audio device or select **My device** > **Search new device**.

When searching for a device, you are to be presented with a list of any device discovered within the range of your Bluetooth-enabled phone. As soon as you select a device and a connection is made, you are prompted to enter in order to pair with the device.

You should create your own password and agree with the owner of the other device to use the same code. Devices that do not have a user interface have a factory-set password. Refer to its documentation for further information.

The pass key feature ensures that only legitimate connections are allowed to connect either to your device or to the selected device.

Establish Bluetooth connection

If the devices are paired successfully, they will be shown in the My Device menu.

Before the connection is established, you can select files, such as pictures and sound, press the N1 key [Options] and select **Send > Via Bluetooth**, then select the paired device. The received files will be saved in **File manager** > **Received**.

Battery saving

Features using Bluetooth technology increase the demand on battery power and reduce the battery life.

If you do not intend to use the Bluetooth feature for some time, you should deactivate it in order to conserve battery power.

8 Settings

You can configure your cellular phone to best suit your usage preferences.

8.1 User Profiles

8.1.1 General

- Activate:** Open the selected mode.

2. Customize

Tone Settings: Includes Incoming Call, Power on, Power off, Cover open, Cover close, Message, Alarm and Keypad. You can select built-in ring tones, or the tones composed by yourself.

Volume: Includes the volume setting of Ringtone and Key Tone. The volume degree is from 1 to 7.

Alert Type:

- Ring only: Just ringing, no vibration.
- Vib. only: Just Vibrating, no ringing.
- Vib. and ring: Vibrating and ringing.
- Vib. then ring: Ringing after vibration.

Ring Type:

- Single: Rings once when a call is coming.
- Repeat: Rings continuously when a call is coming.
- Ascending: Rings continuously and the volume increases gradually.

Connect notice:

- None: No ring and Vibration, It's silent.
- Tone only: Just ringing, no Vibration.
- Vib. only: Just vibration, no ringing.
- Tone and Vib. Ringing and Vibration.

Extra tone:

- Warning: If necessary, you will be warned by the prompt tone.
- Error: You will be warned by a tone if you make a mistake.
- Camp on: A prompt tone will be heard after searching the network successfully.

Answer Mode:

- Cover answer: you can open the cover to answer.
- Any key: Press any key to answer a call (Except of Hang Up Key and Right Soft Key).

8.1.2 Silent

Volume, Alert type may not set. Please refer to "general" for more details.

Note: Long press # key switching to silent mode.

8.1.3 HAC

Please refer to "general" for more details.

8.8 Security settings
You can set safety options for phone, SIM card to prevent your SIM cards from misappropriate.

SIM lock: SIM lock can prevent your SIM card's, After active SIM lock protection, you need to input correct pin code when you went to change the SIM lock's status.

Phone lock: phone lock can prevent your phone from misappropriate. After active phone lock protection, you need to input correct phone lock code when you use it next time. If you select close, you can close this function.

Change password: you can change the Pin's number or the phone's password.


8.9 Network settings
Network selection: You can choose Automatic or Manual to select the network (Auto is recommended). When you select Automatic, the phone will make the preferential selection according to the network where the SIM card belongs. When you select Manual, you are required to select the same network as the registered network with the network operator by SIM card for your use.

Preferences: Select the Preferred Networks. The default network is the network where the SIM card belongs.

GPRS connection: you can set the GPRS connection status.

8.10 Restore factory settings
Access Settings to select Restore Factory Settings, and press OK. All settings can be restored to factory settings with this function. The default password is 0000.

9 File manager
Select **Menu > File**.
Press the N1 key [Options] and select Open to view different folders.

 **Note:** If you have inserted a T-Flash card (external memory card), here you can view its files.

10 Music Player
Keys Operation

Key	Description
N1 Key	List the audio file from the storage you set.
UP key	Press to stop the music.
* or # key	Short press to select the previous song/next song. Press and hold to rewind/fast forward the track during playback.
Volume key	Adjust volume.
N2 Key [Back]	Return to previous menu.


In the music list screen, you can press N1 key [Options] and **select Settings>Player settings> Pre**, playlist to change the storage.

11 Messages
11.1 SMS

This phone can support enhancement SMS (EMS), you can insert templates, names and so on.
Enter SMS menu, you can see options for Write message, Inbox, Drafts, outbox, Templates, SMS setting.

Write message: Create a new message; press left soft key or Ok key to enter options for Send to , Input method, Insert template, insert number and name, and also Save to drafts.

Inbox: Read received SMS in SIM card and phone; Under reading SMS mode, you can select to Reply, Call sender, Save to Phonebook, Forward, Delete, Delete all.


 **Note:** Specific letters (accents) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause your recipient to receive your message as two or more SMS messages.

Drafts: After you have edit a message, you can store it in the drafts, and next time you can send it.

Outbox: You can save MMS failed to send. You can Resend, Edit, Delete, Delete all, Advanced (Use number, Use URL, Use Email, Use USSD, Copy to phone, Move to phone, Copy all, Move all).

Templates: There are 10 useful phrases in the phone, you can use, edit or remove them.

SMS settings: you can set SMS Profile settings, Voicemail server, Common settings, and also you can watch the Memory status, and select the Preferred storage etc.

 **Note:** Make sure the SMS Centre Address in the activated profile is correct; otherwise, you cannot send or receive the messages.

11.2 MMS
MMS means multimedia message service, it can support multimedia and transfer text, pictures, sound or information with various multimedia formats.

MMS need support from network operator. Please check with the network operator to ensure that your SIM card can support such service.

Your phone can support MMS function, after setting MMS, you can send or receive MMS. Enter MMS menu, you can find the options: Write message, Inbox, Outbox, Drafts, MMS settings.

Write message: Create MMS. After editing, you can select **Done** to enter sub menu: Send only, Save and send, Save to drafts, Send options, Exit.


Inbox: Save all received MMS. You can View, Reply, Reply by SMS, Reply all, Forward, Delete, Delete all, Properties, Use details.

Outbox: You can save MMS failed to send. You can View, Forward, Edit, Delete, Delete all, Properties, Use details.

Drafts: You can save MMS draft. You can View, Send, Edit, Delete, Delete all, Properties, Use details.

MMS settings: You can set up for functions: Compose, Send, Retrieve, Filter, Memory status, and also you edit the Profiles.

All function can be operated normally only if all settings are correct, you can also check for storage status.

 **Note:** Make sure the activated profile is correct; otherwise, you cannot send or receive the multimedia messages.

Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

• **TRAFFIC SAFETY:**
Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas. When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

• **CONDITIONS OF USE:**
You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C. Over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Emergency call numbers may not be reachable on all cellular networks. You should never rely only on your phone for emergency calls.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself. Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not paint it.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your phone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. Proof of compliance with international standards (ICNIRP) or with European Directive 1999/5/EC (R&TTE) is required of all mobile phone models before they can be put on the market. The protection of the health and safety for the user and any other person is an essential requirement of these standards or this directive.

THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organization (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2.0 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this device model are:

Maximum SAR for this model and conditions under which it was recorded.		
Head SAR	GSM900	1.09 W/kg
Body-worn SAR	GSM900	1.06 W/kg

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 1.5 cm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device should be positioned at least this distance away from the body. Troubleshooting

Before contacting the after sales department, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

And carry out the following checks:

My mobile phone will not switch on

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

My phone has not responded for several minutes

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

My screen is difficult to read

- Clean your screen
- Use your mobile phone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

My mobile phone turns off by itself

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your mobile phone
- Check the battery charge level

My mobile phone has a low level of autonomy

- Make sure you respected the complete charge timing (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication

My mobile phone will not charge properly

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C-+40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger
- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and charger
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible


My mobile phone will not connect to a network

- Try connecting in another location
- Verify the network coverage with your operator
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid

SIM card error

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted
- Verify with your operator that your SIM card is 3V compatible; the old 5V SIM cards cannot be used
- Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched

Unable to make outgoing calls

- Make sure you have dialed a valid number and press the  key
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your mobile phone is connected to a network, and that the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls


Unable to receive incoming calls

- Make sure your mobile phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls

The caller's name does not appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her number

The sound quality of the calls is not optimal

- You can adjust the volume during a call by means of the Volume key
- Check the radio reception icon level 

I am unable to use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

When I select a number from my directory, the number is not dialed

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

I am unable to create a file in my Phone Book


- Make sure that your SIM card directory is not full; delete some files or save the files in the product Phone Book (i.e. your professional or personal directories)
- Check the "Call barring" option for "Incoming calls" to be sure that the "All calls except SIM directory" feature is not activated

My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

I cannot access my voicemail

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

The  icon is displayed on my standby screen

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the product memory

"No service" is displayed

- You are outside of the network coverage area

I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)
