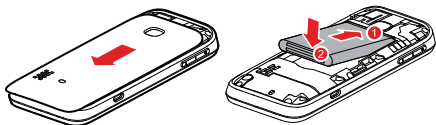
# 1 Getting Started

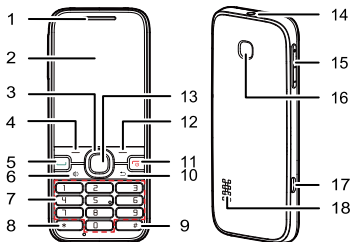





	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Power the phone on or off (press and hold the key for about 3 seconds).</li> <li>• End or reject a call.</li> <li>• Return to standby mode.</li> </ul>
	<p>Turn the speaker on or off (press and hold the key for about 3 seconds).</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Go back to the previous screen.</li> <li>• In editing mode, press the key to delete the character on the left of the cursor, or press and hold the key to delete all the characters.</li> </ul>
	<p>Select the option displayed in the lower left corner of the screen.</p>
	<p>Select the option displayed in the lower right corner of the screen.</p>
	<p>Confirm a selection.</p>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If <b>Standby Screen</b> is set to <b>Concise Mode</b>, access the functions assigned to the navigation keys in standby mode.</li> <li>• Scroll through a menu.</li> </ul>

## 2 Call Functions


### Making a Call

- In standby mode, press the number keys to enter a phone number.
  - To make an international call, press  twice to enter the plus sign (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
  - To call an extension number, enter the switchboard number, press  three times to enter **P** or press  four times to enter **T**, and then enter the extension number.
- Press  to dial the number.
- Press  to end the call or cancel the dialing.

### Answering a Call

When you receive an incoming call, press  to answer it or  to reject it.

If the **Any Key** answer function is enabled, you can press any

key except , , ,  and  to

answer a call. To set this function, select **Menu > Settings > Call > Answer Mode > Any Key**.

If the **Headset Auto-Answer** function is enabled and a headset is connected to the phone, the phone will automatically answer incoming calls for a pre-defined period.

To set this function, select **Menu > Settings > Call > Headset Auto-Answer**.

## Speed Dialing

If the speed dialing numbers are assigned to the number keys, you can press and hold a number key for about 3 seconds in standby mode to speed dial the phone number. Up to 8 speed dialing numbers can be assigned.





For more details, see the section "Contacts" to learn how to assign speed dialing numbers to the contact numbers.

## Call Waiting




Note

The call waiting function is a network-dependent service. For details, contact your service provider.

1. When receiving another call during an active conversation, press  to answer the call, or press  to reject the call.
2. When you are answering the new call, the other call is placed on hold, and you can press  to switch to the other call.
3. Press  to end the two calls.

## 3 Text Input

### Changing the Text Input Mode





The current text input mode indicator is displayed in the upper right corner of the text input screen. To switch between the text input modes, repeatedly press .

You can select **Menu > Settings > Phone > Text Input Settings** to change the input language and enable or disable the predictive input mode.

### Entering English and French

In multi-tap text input mode, press the key labeled with the desired letter to enter the letter on the key.

In predictive input mode:

1. Press each key according to the spelling sequence of the desired word. The phone displays candidate words that may be spelt by the keystroke sequence.
2. Press  or  to scroll to the desired word.
3. Press  or  to enter the desired word, or **0** to enter the word followed by a space.


### Entering a Number




To enter a number:



- In "123" input mode, press the key labeled with the desired number.
- In any input mode other than "123" input mode, press and hold the number key for about 3 seconds to enter the desired number.

### Entering a Symbol

To enter a symbol:



- In any input mode, press  to display the symbol

list. Press  to scroll to the desired symbol. Then press  or  to enter the symbol.



- In multi-tap input mode, repeatedly press **1** to switch between the commonly used symbols.
- In predictive input mode, press **1**, and then press  or  to scroll to the desired symbol.

## 4 Contacts




### Creating a Contact

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Create Contact**.
2. Edit the contact information.
3. Press  or  to save the contact.



### Searching for a Contact


1. Select **Menu > Contacts**.
2. Enter the contact name, or the first several letters of a contact name.
3. Press  and  to scroll to the contact.

### Adding Favorites



1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Favorites > Add Favorites**.
2. Press  and  to scroll to the contact.
3. Press  to add the contact into your list of favorites.

### Adding a Group

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Groups > Add Group**.
2. Edit the group name.
3. Select **Members** and press  to mark the contacts to be included in the group.
4. Press  to save the members.



5. Press  to save the group.

## Assigning Speed Dialing to a Contact

1. Select **Menu > Contacts > Options > Manage Contacts > Speed Dialing**.
2. Select a number from **2** to **9** and press  to confirm.
3. Select a contact from the contact list or enter a number.
4. Press  to save the speed dialing number.

## 5 Messaging

### Creating and Sending a Message



1. Select **Menu > Messaging > New Message**.
2. Add recipients by entering the phone numbers, or press  and then select the recipients from the contact list.
3. Select **Options > Insert Object** to add picture, audio or other attachments to the message.
4. Press  to send the message.

### Message Settings





- In **Chat View** mode, you can send and receive messages with a contact (or number) and view them in a grouped conversation. You can select **Menu > Messaging > Settings > View Mode > Chat View** to set the **Chat View** mode.
- In **Inbox View** mode, the messages you received are saved in **Inbox**, and the messages you sent are saved in **Sent**. You can select **Menu > Messaging > Settings > View Mode > Inbox View** to set the **Inbox View** mode.

## 6 Media Applications

### Camera

1. Select **Menu > Camera**.
2. Press  to configure the camera settings.
3. Press  to take a picture.

### Recorder

1. Select **Menu > Tools > Recorder**.
2. Press  to start recording. While recording, you can press  to pause, and again to resume recording.
3. Press  to stop recording.
4. Press  to play the recording.



#### Note


To ensure an optimal audio effect, keep your phone's microphone close to the sound source when recording.

### Managing Multimedia Files

You can select **Menu > Gallery** to manage images and audios stored on your phone. You can view pictures, set a picture as wallpaper, set an audio clip as ringtone, and send multimedia files via Bluetooth or message.

## 7 Browser

The **Browser** application allows you to access Internet websites and browse web pages.

1. Select **Menu > Browser** to open the home page.
2. Select **Options > Open New Page**.
3. Enter the Uniform Resource Locator (URL) and press  to access the new web page you desired.

 Note

You can select **Options** > **Settings** to customize browser settings to suit your web browsing style and configure page content, private data, and security settings.

4. Select **Options** > **Exit Browser** to exit browser.

## 8 Bluetooth

Your phone supports Bluetooth. You can transfer data between your phone and other Bluetooth devices and talk by using a Bluetooth headset.

1. Select **Menu** > **Tools** > **Bluetooth**.
2. Select **Bluetooth** > **On** to enable the Bluetooth function.
3. Select **Search for Devices** to search for available Bluetooth devices.
4. Select the Bluetooth device you want to connect from the list and press  to pair your phone with the desired device.

 Note


- When you pair your phone with the device for the first time, a password is required.
  - A Bluetooth headset is not included in the product package and must be purchased separately. Before using a Bluetooth headset, refer to the user manuals of the relevant devices.
5. When the Bluetooth devices are connected to your phone, you can exchange data between your phone and the other Bluetooth device.


## 9 Security

### Keypad Lock



Note

When the keypad is locked, you can still press  to answer a call or make an emergency call.

To lock the keypad, press and hold  for about 3 seconds in standby mode.

To unlock the keypad, press , then .

If the **Auto Keypad Lock** function is enabled, the phone's keypad will automatically lock after being idle in standby mode for a pre-defined period. To set this function, select **Menu > Settings > Phone > Auto Keypad Lock**.


### Phone Lock

The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. To enable or disable the phone lock, select **Menu > Settings > Security > Phone Lock**.

Once you enable the phone lock, you must enter the password. The default password to unlock your phone is **0000**, and it can be changed to any numeric string of four to eight digits in length. You can select **Menu > Settings > Security > Change Phone Lock Code** to change the password.

## 10 Troubleshooting

If you encounter any problem when using your phone, try to rectify the problem according to the following table. If the problem persists, contact the service provider or the dealer.

Problem	Ensure that...
The battery cannot be charged.	The charger is properly connected to your phone and the power socket.
The phone cannot be powered on.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The battery power is sufficient.</li> <li>• The battery is properly installed.</li> <li>• Press and hold  for about 3 seconds.</li> </ul>
You cannot make a call except an emergency call.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The phone number is correct.</li> <li>• You are in the network service area.</li> <li>• You have not enabled the call restriction function.</li> </ul>
Bad call quality.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The signal strength is strong enough.</li> <li>• If you are staying indoors, move close to a window.</li> </ul>
During a call, the other side cannot hear your voice.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The microphone is not covered.</li> <li>• If you use a wired headset, make sure connector is fully plugged in.</li> </ul>
The signal strength is not strong enough or your phone is often off line.	Move close to a place with strong signal strength.

Problem	Ensure that...
<p>Your phone displays "No service found", "Service unavailable" or "Network problem".</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You are in an area with very weak signal or outside your service provider's network coverage (in a tunnel or surrounded by buildings). If so, move to another area and try again.</li> <li>• Do not utilize the service option without obtaining authorization from your service provider.</li> </ul>
<p>The phone cannot find other Bluetooth devices or fails to send or receive data via Bluetooth.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Bluetooth function of both devices is turned on.</li> <li>• The distance between the two Bluetooth devices is less than 10 meters.</li> <li>• There are no obstacles between the two devices.</li> <li>• The other Bluetooth device is set to visible.</li> </ul>

## 11 Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

### Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do

not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

### **Medical Device**

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids. For any such problems, consult your service provider.
- To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your device is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth components must be disabled during a call.

### **Potentially Explosive Atmosphere**

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or a fire, resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not power on your device at refueling points such as service stations. Comply with restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage, and distribution areas, and chemical plants. In

addition, adhere to restrictions in areas where blasting operations are in progress. Before using the device, watch out for areas that have potentially explosive atmospheres that are often, but not always, clearly marked. Such locations include areas below the deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders. Ask the manufacturers of vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) whether this device can be safely used in their vicinity.

### **Traffic Security**

Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. In addition, if using the device while driving a vehicle, comply with the following guidelines:

- Concentrate on driving. Your first responsibility is to drive safely.
- Do not talk on the device while driving. Use hands-free accessories.
- When you have to make or answer a call, park the vehicle at the road side before using your device.
- RF signals may affect electronic systems of motor vehicles. For more information, consult the vehicle manufacturer.
- In a motor vehicle, do not place the device over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Otherwise, the device may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.
- Do not use your device while flying in an aircraft. Power off your device before boarding an aircraft. Using wireless devices in an aircraft may cause danger to the operation

of the aircraft and disrupt the wireless telephone network. It may also be considered illegal.

## **Operating Environment**

- Do not use or charge the device in dusty, damp, and dirty places or places with magnetic fields. Otherwise, it may result in a malfunction of the circuit.
- The device complies with the RF specifications when the device is used near your ear or at a distance of 1.5 cm from your body. Ensure that the device accessories such as a device case and a device holster are not composed of metal components. Keep your device 1.5 cm away from your body to meet the requirement earlier mentioned.
- On a stormy day with thunder, do not use your device when it is being charged, to prevent any danger caused by lightning.
- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching the antenna affects the call quality and results in increase in power consumption. As a result, the talk time and the standby time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 45°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 45°C for using the device powered by a battery.

## **Prevention of Hearing Damage**

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

## **Safety of Children**

Comply with all precautions with regard to children's safety. Letting the child play with your device or its accessories, which may include parts that can be detached from the device, may be dangerous, as it may present a choking hazard. Ensure that small children are kept away from the device and accessories.

## **Accessories**

Choose only batteries, chargers, and accessories approved for use with this model by the device manufacturer. The use of any other type of battery, charger, or accessory may invalidate any warranty for the device, may be in violation of local rules or laws, and may be dangerous. Please contact your dealer for information about the availability of approved batteries, chargers, and accessories in your area.

## **Battery and Charger**

- Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times before it eventually wears out. When the standby time and the talk time are shorter than the normal time, replace the battery.
- Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage may cause a fire or a malfunction of the charger.
- Do not connect two poles of the battery with conductors, such as metal materials, keys, or jewelries. Otherwise, the battery may be short-circuited and may cause injuries and burns on your body.

- If battery electrolyte leaks out, ensure that the electrolyte does not touch your skin and eyes. When the electrolyte touches your skin or splashes into your eyes, wash your eyes with clean water immediately and consult a doctor.
- If there is a case of battery deformation, color change, or abnormal heating while you charge or store the battery, remove the battery immediately and stop using it. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, overheating, explosion, or fire.
- If the power cable is damaged (for example, the cord is exposed or broken), or the plug loosens, stop using the cable at once. Otherwise, it may lead to an electric shock, a short circuit of the charger, or a fire.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire as they may explode. Batteries may also explode if damaged.
- Do not modify or remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Avoid dropping the device or battery. If the device or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a qualified service center for inspection.
- Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion or other hazard.
- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.
- The device should only be connected to products that bear the USB-IF logo or have completed the USB-IF compliance program.

- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Recycle or dispose of used batteries according to the local regulations or reference instruction supplied with your device.

## **Cleaning and Maintenance**

- The device, battery, and charger are not water-resistant. Keep them dry. Protect the device, battery, and charger from water or vapor. Do not touch the device or the charger with a wet hand. Otherwise, it may lead to a short circuit, a malfunction of the device, and an electric shock to the user.
- Do not place your device, battery, and charger in places where they can get damaged because of collision. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, device malfunction, overheating, fire, or explosion.
- Do not place magnetic storage media such as magnetic cards and floppy disks near the device. Radiation from the device may erase the information stored on them.
- Do not leave your device, battery, and charger in a place with an extreme high or low temperature. Otherwise, they may not function properly and may lead to a fire or an explosion. When the temperature is lower than 0°C, performance of the battery is affected.
- Do not place sharp metal objects such as pins near the earpiece. The earpiece may attract these objects and hurt you when you are using the device.
- Before you clean or maintain the device, power off the device and disconnect it from the charger.
- Do not use any chemical detergent, powder, or other

chemical agents (such as alcohol and benzene) to clean the device and the charger. Otherwise, parts of the device may be damaged or a fire can be caused. You can clean the device and the charger with a piece of damp and soft antistatic cloth.

- Do not dismantle the device or accessories. Otherwise, the warranty on the device and accessories is invalid and the manufacturer is not liable to pay for the damage.
