HANDSET DESCRIPTION



BASIC FUNCTIONS

THE FUNCTION KEYS



This key is used to make or receive a call.



This key is used to terminate a call or exit the current menu. This key is used to turn the handset on or off.



This key (also called the Navigation key) is used to scroll through the contents of the menu.



(Soft 1) This key is used to access the menu.



(Soft 2) This key is used to access voice or text messages and to return to the previous directory on the menu.



This key is used to access the web.



This key is used to clear characters.



Press and hold to set up (vibration) manner mode.



Press and hold to set up key guard mode.

DISPLAY INDICATORS

SCREEN STATUS, DISPLAY AND FUNCTION



Signal Strength

Indicates current signal strength.
More lines mean better signal strength.






Roaming

Indicates the phone is outside of its home area.



Service Indicator

When a call is in progress,  is displayed.
When  is displayed, the phone is in idle mode.
When  is displayed, the phone is not receiving a signal from the system.



Message

Indicates a text message or voice mail message is waiting.



Digital mode

Indicates the phone is operating in digital mode.



Battery

Indicates battery charge level status.
The more black you see, the greater the charge.



Mute

Indicates the phone is mute while on a call.



Scratchpad

Displays when scratchpad is in use during a call.



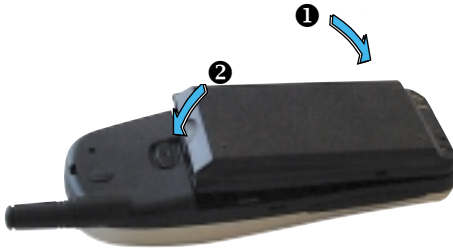
Emergency Call

Blinks when an emergency call is in progress.

USING THE BATTERY

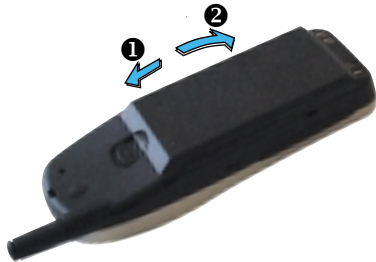
INSTALLING THE BATTERY

- 1 Insert the bottom of battery into the groove at the bottom of the handset. Then 2 press in the top of the battery until it snaps.



REMOVING THE BATTERY

- 1 Push the tab 1 with one hand and lift the top of the battery 2 to separate.



The battery must be correctly placed in the battery compartment. If battery is incorrectly inserted, the handset will not turn on or the battery may slip out during use.

CHARGING THE BATTERY

POWER CONNECTION

- 1 Connect the charger to a standard. The LED will light green when the power is connected.



CHARGING THE BATTERY ONLY

- 1 To charge the battery only, insert the battery pack into the charging slot on the charger. The LED will indicate the charging status.
 - Red indicates charging is in progress.
 - Green indicates charging is complete.



- Battery is not charged when you purchase the product.
- Fully charge the battery before use.

CHARGING THE BATTERY

CHARGING THE BATTERY WITH THE HANDSET

- 1 To charge the battery with the handset, insert the handset into the charger.



Charging the battery with the handset power on is less efficient than charging it with the handset off.

CHARGING COMPLETION

- 1 Charging is completed when the green-colored LED stays on.



CHARGING THE BATTERY

If the red LED does not come on after the handset or battery has been inserted into the charging slots, re-insert or check power.

IMPORTANT BATTERY INFORMATION

Use only batteries and chargers approved by the phone manufacturer.

When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for longer than a week; overcharging may shorten its life.

If left unused, a fully charged battery may completely drain (discharge) in 1 - 4 weeks.

Never use any charger or battery that is damaged or worn out.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose.

Do not short circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can occur when a metallic object (e.g. coin, clip or pen) causes direct connection of the two terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery). For example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, reduces the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 41°F and 95°F (5°C and 35°C). A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work (or charge) even if the battery is fully charged.

Temperature extremes affect the ability of your battery to charge; allow it to cool down or warm up first.

When the battery is not in use, store it uncharged in a cool, dark and dry place.

The battery is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts. Do not attempt to open the case.

It is recommended that you allow your battery to fully discharge before you recharge it.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times but will eventually wear out. When the operating time is shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Do not dispose of a battery in a fire!

Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.

TURNING THE PHONE ON AND OFF

TURNING THE PHONE ON

- 1
 - Press [].
 - The phone is locked if "PASSWORD" is displayed on the screen. When "PASSWORD" is displayed, enter the 4-digit password to unlock the phone.
 - The default password is the last 4 digits of your phone number.






TURNING THE PHONE OFF

- 1
 - Press [] until "Power off!" is displayed.



- If the "LOW BATTERY WARNING POWER OFF" is displayed and the power goes off, there is a possibility of damaging the memory. Change or charge the battery immediately.
- If the battery is removed while the phone is on, information about the last call may be erased.

HOW TO USE THE MENU

- 1 In the standby screen, press [] to enter the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key or the volume keys to scroll through the menu.
- 3 To return to the previous menu, press []
To exit the current menu, press []
- 4 To enter submenu, press the corresponding number or select the item using the navigation key or the volume keys.
- 5 [], [], volume keys and navigation key can be used while using the menu.

BASIC FUNCTIONS

MAKING A CALL

Enter the phone number.




To modify the phone number you have entered :

- To erase the last number entered : Press [].
- To erase all numbers entered and start again : Press []

- "CALL FAILED" message is displayed when the call does not connect.

Pause Definitions

BASIC FUNCTIONS

HOW TO ANSWER CALLS

- 1 When the phone rings or the LED blinks, press any key except Volume up or down, or [].
- 2 To end the call, press [].



If you set up the AUTO ANSWER function in advance, the call will be answered after the selected number of rings. (refer to page 30)

CALLER ID FUNCTION



When there is an incoming call, the caller's phone number is displayed on the screen.



The Caller ID number is saved in the call log.


CALL WAITING FUNCTION

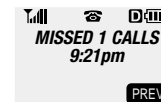
This function notifies you of an incoming call when you are on the another call.

- To answer the call, press [] when you hear the beep.
- To switch back to the first caller, press [] again.

BASIC FUNCTIONS


MISSED CALL DISPLAY

- 1 Displays the number of missed calls and the time the call was missed.
 - The message will be cleared when you press the [] or [] key.





HOW TO ADJUST VOLUME

You can adjust the volume in two ways: by using the volume control keys on the side of the handset, or by using the menu.

- 1 Adjust volume by using the volume control keys during the following operation.
 - During a Call : Earpiece volume adjustment.
 - Standby Status : Ringer volume adjustment.
 - When the Phone Rings : Ringer volume adjustment.
 - Call status in hands-free : Hands-free volume adjustment. Press [] when the phone rings and it will mute the ringer.


VIBRATE

This function disables the ringer and vibrates the phone to alert you of an incoming call. To enable this function, press [], [3],[1] and select VIBRATE or press [] then the “up” and “down” keys at the upper left side of the phone.



FUNCTIONS DURING A CALL

SENDING YOUR NUMBER TO A PAGER

This function enables the phone number of the handset to be transmitted automatically to a pager, depending on pager service.

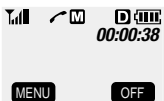
- 1
 - During a call to a pager, when you are asked to enter your number in editing mode, press [], then [1] "SEND PHONE #".

SCRATCH PAD

- 1 While on a call press [], then [2] "SCRATCH PAD".
- 2 Enter the phone number, then press [].

MUTE

- 1 Press [], then [3] "Mute".



To unmute, press [], then [3] "Mute" again.

HOW TO STORE A PHONE NUMBER

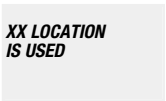
You can store up to 100 frequently used phone numbers in memory.


- 1 Enter the phone number (more than 3 digits) you want to store and press [], then [1] "Store"



- The first available initial empty memory location number is displayed. Press [] to store.
- If there is a desired memory location number, enter the number.

- 2 If the "XX LOCATION IS USED" message appears after entering the memory location number, it means there is another stored phone number in that location already.



- 3 Enter the person's name and press [].



- 4 Select mobile/office/home type then press [].



- 5 To make secret, select "Yes". If "Yes" is selected, the stored entry can only be displayed with the lock code.






HOW TO STORE A PHONE NUMBER

HOW TO ENTER LETTERS AND CHARACTERS USING THE KEYPAD

1. You can change the character mode by pressing [].
2. When entering any special characters such as !?@_+ =()*#:;%/ , press the numeric key associated with it in special mode where special characters are displayed on the top of the screen.
3. Press the navigation key "up or down" to display different special characters.
4. Press [#] to make a blank space. The cursor moves to the next column automatically in two seconds.
5. Repeat until all the characters you want are entered. You can store up to 16 characters.
6. Erasing Entry. To erase one letter, press []. To erase the entire entry, press and hold [].

HOW TO MAKE A CALL USING A STORED PHONE NUMBER

ONE-TOUCH/TWO-TOUCH DIALING

This feature allows the phone book entries to be dialed via the keypad.

ONE-TOUCH DIALING:

1-9 : Press corresponding memory number and hold for more than 1 second.

TWO-TOUCH DIALING:

00, 10-99 : press the first digit and second digits of the memory number short and long respectively.

- If no phone number is stored in the location keyed "Empty Location" will appear on the screen.
- If a phone number is stored in the secret location, the number is not displayed when making a call.




*One-touch dialing must be turned on in the handset.

HOW TO FIND YOUR CALL LOGS

Your phone can display the 10 most recent missed, incoming and outgoing calls. You can call those numbers without dialing their whole number.

MISSED CALLS

- 1 Press [], then [1], then [1], then [1].

- 2 Press [] to check the detail information about the phone number.

- The last missed call, its phone number, time and date are displayed.

- 3 Search phone numbers using navigation key.
 - [] scrolls through the menu
 - [] edits the phone#.

AUTO RETRY

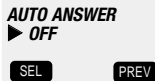

 - Auto answer function does not work if you select lamp.

ONE-TOUCH DIALING

This function allows the phone book entries to be dialed via the keypad.

- 1 Press [], then [2], then [3].
- 2 Select the parameter (NO, YES) by using the navigation keys. Press [].



VOICE PRIVACY

- 1 Press [], then [2], then [4].
- 2 Select the parameter (STANDARD MODE, ENHANCED MODE) by using the navigation key. Press [].

BACKLIGHT

LIGHTING LENGTH

This function allows the time the screen is lit, so you can conveniently use the phone, even in dark places.

- 1 Press [], then [2], then [5].
- 2 Select the parameter (OFF, OFF IN DAY, 10 SECS, 20 SECS, 30 SECS) by using the navigation key. Press [].


DISPLAY

LCD CONTRAST

This function adjusts the LCD screen contrast.

- 1 Press [], then [2], then [6].




- 2 Select the contrast level by using the navigation key. Press [].

LANGUAGE

This function changes the language of the phone.


- 1 Press [], then [2], then [7].



- 2 Select the parameter (ENGLISH, SPANISH) by using the navigation key. Press [].

WEB IDLE TIMER


This function disconnects from the network when there is no key input while browsing through the web. The display remains in the browser and handset connects to the network again.


- 1 Press [], then [2], then [8], then [1]. Then input the Web Idle Timer.




VOLUME

RINGER MODE


- 1 Press [], then [3], then [1].
- 2 Select the parameter (RINGER,SLIDE BELL VIBRATE, SILENT, BELL AFTER VIB) by using the navigation key.

- 3 Press [].



RINGER TYPE

- 1 Press [], then [3], then [2].
- 2 Select the parameter (1-13) by using the navigation key.
 - Different tones (1-6).
 - Different melodies (7-13).



- 3 Press [].

KEYPAD

- 1 Press [], then [3], then [3] for keypad volume.
 - If the warning alarm sounds because of low battery, the sound will not be heard even if the user presses the button.
- 2 Select the volume level by using the navigation key. Press it up to raise the volume and down to lower it.

LOW SIGNAL ALERT

This function sounds an alert when the signal of a received call is weak during a call.

 - This rhythm affects our memory, susceptibility to fright, acceptance of knowledge and logical and analytic power with a cycle of 33 days.

EXPOSURE TO RADIO FREQUENCY SIGNALS

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals.

In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for handheld wireless phones. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies:

ANSI C95.1 (1992) *
NCRP Report 86 (1986) *
ICNIRP (1996) *

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from universities, government health agencies, and industry reviewed the available body of research to develop the ANSI Standard (C951).

The design of your phone complies with the FCC guidelines (and those standards).

ANTENNA CARE

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone and may violate FCC regulations.

DRIVING SAFETY

Talking on the phone while driving is extremely dangerous and is illegal in some states. Remember, safety comes first. Check the laws and regulations on the use of phones in the areas where you drive. Always obey them.

Also, if using your phone while driving please:

- Give full attention to driving. Driving safely is your first responsibility.
- Use hands-free operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call, if driving conditions require.

If you must use the phone while driving, please use one-touch, speed dialing, and auto answer modes.

An airbag inflates with great force. DO NOT place objects, including both installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the airbag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF energy. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone.

Pacemakers

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6") inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

If you have a pacemaker:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than six inches from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Turn your phone OFF in healthcare facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or healthcare facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Posted Facilities

Turn your phone OFF where posted notices so require.

OTHER SAFETY GUIDELINES

Aircraft

FCC and Transport Canada Regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Switch OFF your phone before boarding an aircraft.

Blasting Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone OFF when in a "blasting area" or in areas posted: "Turn off two-way radio." Obey all signs and instructions.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Turn your phone OFF when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include fueling areas such as gas stations; below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane); areas where the air contains chemicals or articles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders; and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

PRECAUTIONS

Your Handheld Portable Telephone is a high quality piece of equipment. Before operating the equipment, read all instructions and cautionary markings on (1) AC Adaptor (2) Battery and (3) Product Using Battery.

1. DO NOT use this equipment in an extreme environment where high temperature or high humidity exists.
2. DO NOT abuse the equipment. Avoid striking, shaking or shocking. When not using the unit, lay down the unit to avoid possible damage due to instability.
3. DO NOT expose this equipment to rain or spilled beverages.
4. DO NOT use unauthorized accessories.
5. DO NOT disassemble the phone or its accessories. If service or repair is required, return unit to an authorized Audiovox cellular service center. If unit is disassembled, the risk of electric shock or fire may result.
6. DO NOT short-circuit the battery terminals with metal items etc.

CAUTIONS

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.

Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operation with the back of the phone kept 0.5 inches (1.27cm) from the body. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.5 inches (1.27cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. All belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories used by this device must not contain any metallic components. Body-worn accessories that do not meet these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure limits and should be avoided.

Vehicle Mounted External Antenna(optional, if available)

A minimum separation distance of 7.9 inches (20cm) must be maintained between the user/bystander and the vehicle mounted external antenna to satisfy FCC RF exposure requirements.

PROTECT YOUR WARRANTY
